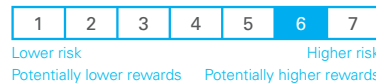

## FUND AIM

The objective of the Fund is to provide growth above that of the FTSE World Europe ex UK TR Net Index, the "Benchmark Index". The Fund aims to outperform the Benchmark Index by 4% per annum. This objective is before the deduction of any charges and measured over rolling three year periods.

## RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



The synthetic risk and reward indicator (SRRI) is based on the historic volatility of the fund's value and it may change in the future.

The fund is in category 6 because it invests in company shares which are sensitive to variations in the stock market. The value of company shares can change substantially over short periods of time.

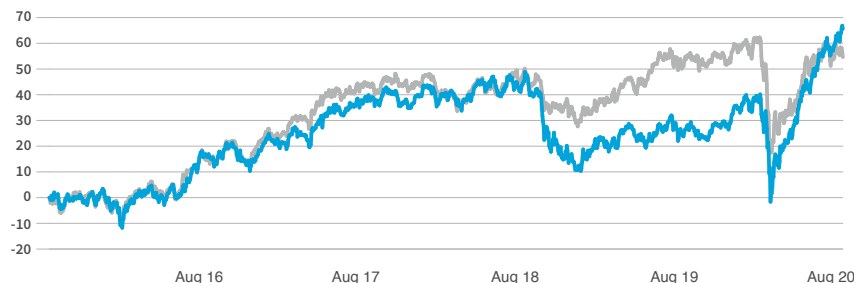

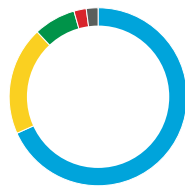

## FUND MANAGER COMMENTARY

European equity markets continue to perform well despite government bond yields grinding higher. European government policy response is shaping up well, with central banks support still acting as a positive for equity markets. However, economic activity readings suggest the phase of data normalisation from March lows appears over as we start to see some evidence to suggest the recovery may stall from here. The rebound of COVID-19 cases and lockdown restrictions across parts of Europe remains a concern.

The FTSE World Europe ex UK index delivered a gain of 2.2% in the period, which lagged the US and Asia Pacific territories. Much of this stems from style bias, where value outperformed growth in the region. At the sector level, industrials, consumer services and both resource industries were all strong. While defensive sectors saw underperformance, led by healthcare and utilities.

The L&G European Trust delivered strong performance, gaining +6.5% in the period. Stock selection and sector allocation both made positive contributions, helping to extend year-to-date outperformance. Selection within industrials, consumer goods and healthcare made a strong contribution. This was marginally offset by disappointing relative returns within basic materials. For positioning, the underweight in utilities and healthcare added the most value. At the stock level, Alfen, Varta, Shop Apotheke, Schibsted, Aluflexpack, Vestas Wind Systems and Neste all saw double digit returns and made a healthy positive contribution to return. On the flipside, Philips and Delivery Hero underperformed. There was no new trading activity in the period.

### CARBON RESERVES

Carbon reserves are fossil fuels (coal, oil and gas) which, if burnt, will become the carbon emissions of the future. To meet global climate change targets, the unabated use of fossil fuels is expected to decline over time.

### CARBON EMISSIONS

Following the global Paris Agreement on climate change, companies in all sectors are expected to reduce their emissions to prepare and adapt for a low-carbon economy.

Carbon emissions intensity describes the relationship between the carbon emissions of a company and its sales<sup>ii</sup>.
